Sidney “Sid” Chapman, Ed.D is the current President of the Georgia Association of Educators (GAE), a state affiliate of the National Educators Association. Before taking the helm as the leader of Georgia’s oldest statewide teaching organization, Dr. Chapman taught high school social studies as well as English for technical college and trade school. During the early years of his teaching career, Dr. Chapman received statewide recognition and honors for being a true

trailblazer among his peer educators in Georgia.
